## Dear Friends and Fellow Tree Lovers

The weather this year reminds me of 2010, when we had 22" for rain through July 6, and 2.5" the rest of the year, before it really got dry. Let's hope that is not a harbinger of the rest of the year. I have often said, 'it takes weather extremes to make weather averages', but, extreme or not, I will never turn down a rain in west Texas. Rainwater is mildly acidic and does a wonderful job of flushing out some of the salts that we apply to the soil every time the sprinkler comes on.

One of the most important thing we can do in the urban landscape for water conservation is to plant trees and shrubs that are adapted to our soil and water, taking into consideration both quality and quantity. Another important thing is to water deeply and thoroughly, not frequent and shallow. Frequent shallow watering results in excessive salt build up in the top few inches of soil. A result of that is higher pH and tie-up of micro nutrients such as iron. One of the trees that suffer the most from this chlorosis is Bradford Pear. If your trees are yellow, give us a call. We can fix that.



I know that summer is just coming on and Christmas is the last thing on everyone's mind, but we will begin [Christmas Décor](#) installations in only 4 months. ## Tree Of The Quarter

Southwest White Pine, *Pinus strobiformis*, which was grouped in with Limber Pine, *Pinus flexilis*, for many years. It grows in the Davis Mountains and the Guadalupe Mountains of far SW Texas. It is a tall graceful tree. It is hard to find in nurseries, but well worth is if you can find it. I know that a local entomologist was growing some several years ago at their place in NM. It is quite drought tolerant and should do very well for us in most of the western half of Texas.

Actually, the Limber Pine, which is found further north in NM around Taos and Las Vegas area, should also do well here. You may have a little easier time finding it and it does quite well here.

## GIVE YOUR TREES TLC

Along with the severe thunderstorms of the season, comes the potential destruction to your trees. The most wide spread destruction will come from high winds. Trees break first at defects, but a collapsing thunderstorm can kick up winds that break even a sound tree. Branch angles less than 30 degrees tend to be weak and are the kind that split first. If you have these narrow crotch trees, please give one of our [Certified Arborists](#) a call. We can install a cabling and bracing system that meets the ANSI standards and can prevent a lot of damage.

## CRITTERS AND CRUDS

Severe prolonged cold temperatures are one of the most important parts of controlling insect populations. West Texas had a fairly mild winter and critters that normally have multiple generations may have one or two more this year. When you are dealing with critters that can lay upwards of 200 eggs and most are viable due to lack on natural controls, that last generation can be a doozy. Getting a handle on problems early is very important. Give one of our [Certified Arborists](#) a call.

In the entire area, we are seeing a greater occurrence of Oak Wilt. This uptick seems to be greatest in Midland, but TLC has been getting more calls for Oak Wilt this year than normal over the entire area. So far, Oak Wilt has not been found in the Fort Davis, Marfa and Alpine area. Let's hope that area never gets that disease.

Cottonwood Leaf Beetle and Elm Leaf Beetle are both busy chewing their way through leaves and causing stress on trees. A timely application of a systemic insecticide will manage this problem.
